
# From the Desk of Fr. Chris

We enter the most unique week of the Church year. Today we begin Mass with triumphant "Hosannas" for Palm Sunday and finish with the somber notes of Passion Sunday when we leave. We will engage in ancient symbols, actions, and rituals that we only encounter during these special celebrations. Perhaps you would like to participate in some of the celebrations that are unique to this week:

The **Chrism Mass** is on Monday at St. Augustine Cathedral at 2pm. At this Mass we bless the Oils used for Anointing the Sick and Anointing the Catechumens, and consecrate the Sacred Chrism used for Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders. Priests will renew their promises to the Bishop.

**Triduum Celebration** - Holy Thursday Commemoration of the Lord's Supper, Good Friday Passion of the Lord w/ Veneration of the Cross, and Easter Vigil, all at 7pm. I love how this is really one celebration spanning three days. Notice all the ancient symbols and gestures that are only encountered at these celebrations. It is at the Easter Vigil that we finally welcome our Elect and Candidates as full members of the Catholic community!

Holy Week Mission Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday at 6pm. "Here's Hoping..." Fathers Bob and Dick Gielow will help us prepare for the great feast of Easter. Come to one or all three. Wednesday night will conclude with many priests present for Communal Reconciliation. Have a Blessed Holy Week!

#### Holy Week Mission "Here's Hoping..." April 14, 15, 16

Are you so involved scurrying around with business, children, family, social activities etc., that you have little time for quiet contemplation with God? A parish mission is a time of special grace when God calls us into a deeper relationship with Him, a time for personal growth, a time to listen to God, a time for spiritual refreshment and renewal.

Join twin brothers Fr. Bob Gielow and Fr. Dick Gielow each evening at 6pm in Church as we begin Holy Week. There will be a special mass with a homily from the twins designed for a Lenten Renewal. A reception will follow Mon. & Tues. evening to enhance our community life. (\*April 16 session will flow into individual Penance.)

The twins have been conducting parish missions for more than 40 years and have celebrated over 50 years of priesthood. They have ministered as principal of high school, director of campus ministry, director of athletics and retreat master. They have advanced degrees in Philosophy, Theology, Religious Education, Counseling, Divinity, Religious Studies and Pastoral Studies. Their ministry has offered them experiences all over the world. They don't always conduct parish missions together, so this is something special.

They were born in LaSalle, III. And are members of the Congregation of the Mission (Vincentians) founded by St. Vincent De Paul. Fr. Dick lives in Leawood, Kansas and Fr. Bob lives in Lemont, III. They have one sister, Mary Ann, who lives in Tucson and is a member of Corpus Christi.

#### **Religious Education the Family Way Family Faith Formation**

This month the children who are preparing for their First Communion have been focusing on the Sacrament of Reconciliation, more commonly referred to as Confession. While I've heard some Catholics express gratefulness in regards to this sacrament, most of us avoid it. Who wants to look deeply into their faults? We try to justify our actions or forget them, but that doesn't always work especially when we may hang onto the thought that it's up to us to earn acceptance.

Admitting fault might feel like we're admitting that we aren't worthy. But Jesus taught and showed that God's love is not dependent on our actions. Confession gives us an opportunity to feel that forgiveness, to hear out loud that we are forgiven, and to stop believing that we don't belong.

Even without the sacrament, it's still important to reflect on the times when we could have done better, and pray for guidance. We will never be without sin, but through forgiveness we can live more humbly and love more deeply.

#### "Keep Watch with Me" Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament SIGN UP FOR HOLY THURSDAY ADORATION

At Holy Thursday mass, we remember the Last Supper that Jesus shared with his disciples. And then Jesus asked them to keep watch with him in the garden before he is taken by the soldiers to be crucified.

On Holy Thursday, the priest consecrates not only the bread for that mass, but enough for Good Friday as well. The bread for Friday is taken to the Community Center after mass for adoration until midnight and then held in reserve until the Good Friday service. Come watch with Jesus. You can spend any amount of time with him after Holy Thursday mass, thus entering more deeply into the Triduum, the holiest days of the church year.

According to the Congregation for Divine Worship, "It is an invitation to silent and prolonged adoration of the wondrous sacrament instituted by Christ on this day."

To assure that all times are covered, please sign up in the narthex until the Wednesday, before Holy Thursday. If all slots are filled, you may just come at your preferred time.

Easter Triduum

The days are a continuous rite ... the day never ends ...

Holy Thursday ends the 40 days of Lent and, as the sun sets tonight, we begin the Paschal Triduum. The first Eucharist was more than a simple meal; it was a sign of the sacrifice Jesus would offer. All who share at the Eucharistic table take part in the sacrifice through

# Good Friday

Continuing the holiest three days of the church today, in a profound way, we enter into Christ's Paschal mystery. Walk the Stations of the Cross on the Meditation Mile at noon. Visit the church for meditation, Noon - 3 PM. In the evening we once again read the Passion according to John, remembering the crucifixion of our Lord and

> venerating His cross. Today we collect donations for the Holy Land.

Easter Vigil Easter Vigil is the most important liturgy of the year, when we celebrate our faith in the Resurrection. There are four parts to this liturgy: the fire rite shattering the darkness, the liturgy of the word telling God's plan for salvation, baptism of the elect and renewal of our own baptismal promises, Eucharist in which we experience the presence of the risen Christ in the community. The service will start in the courtyard and continue in the church. If you've never attended this moving mass,

come this year.



Today we celebrate Christ's resurrection, showing God's ultimate power over death, and opening the door of eternity to all believers. Today is an Alleluia day, ending the Triduum and beginning 50 days of rejoicing. We are an Alleluia people, whose hearts have been changed and who now go forth to share God's love in the world.
